

Bowenwork for People Living with Cancer

I. Rationale:

This class focuses on applying Bowenwork to support people living with cancer (PLWC), who are actively undergoing cancer treatment, in remission, or in palliative care. Bowenwork is a safe, effective modality for all clients, their families and caregivers that can optimize quality of life and wellbeing throughout the various stages of cancer.

II. Presentation Aims and Outcomes:

Aims:

The class incorporates a paradigm shift from disease management to facilitating health, wellness and 'wholeness'. By becoming more aware of issues and vulnerabilities that PLWC face in treatment and recovery, Bowenwork practitioners can become more confident in recommending Bowenwork as a safe, gentle, relaxing adjunct to conventional approaches and support clients, their families and caregivers in finding ways to cope as they navigate the cancer-management milieu.

Bowenwork is safe for people of all ages, acute and chronic illnesses, palliative care and hospice settings. Participants learn how Bowenwork, a gentle therapy known for its "less is best" approach, optimizes clients' biopsychological wellness, no matter what state of health a person is in, and can reduce unpleasant side-effects of cancer treatment.

Specific Learning Outcomes:

- Identify specific health challenges PLWC may face, relative to various stages and treatment they are undergoing, and how Bowenwork may benefit them.
- Identify vulnerabilities that PLWC may have and how Bowenwork practitioners may need to adapt techniques and procedures to accommodate them.
- Discuss rationale for choosing appropriate procedures and session plans for PLWC.
- Identify Bowenwork procedures to address common symptoms that PLWC experience from their diagnosis, treatment and side-effects.
- Name resources that practitioners can direct clients towards, to empower them in improving their health, wellbeing and recovery from cancer, or quality end of life support.
